

District Chair - Responsibilities

Hold an activity once a month in the district and invite neighbors and other democrats in the district. The event will be of the district chair's choosing but will focus on training people to do the tasks of turning out the Democratic voters in their district in the upcoming election.

It might include a discussion on framing issues, canvassing a precinct with literature on the Democratic Party, helping with a voter registration drive in an area, phone banking to Democratic voters about an upcoming event or anything that might help get people engaged and ready for the work of the upcoming election.

The district chair's goals are:

- Get volunteers trained and comfortable for election work;
- Keep volunteers engaged;
- Encourage an occasional volunteer to become a regular volunteer, encourage a regular volunteer to become a Precinct Captain Assistant, and encourage a Precinct Captain Assistant to become a Precinct Captain; all with the idea of maximizing the number of Precinct Captains and trained volunteers in your district to help turn out Democratic voters in the upcoming general election.

Other Election Activities

During the General Election Time you may be called upon by your local Democratic Elected Officials or Democratic Nominees running for office to help contact your volunteers and captains and to get recommendations for who might be good at a particular task.
